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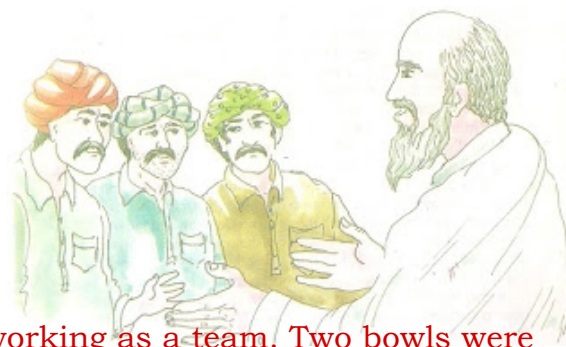

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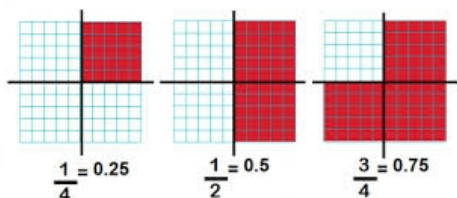
Mind Map about personalities

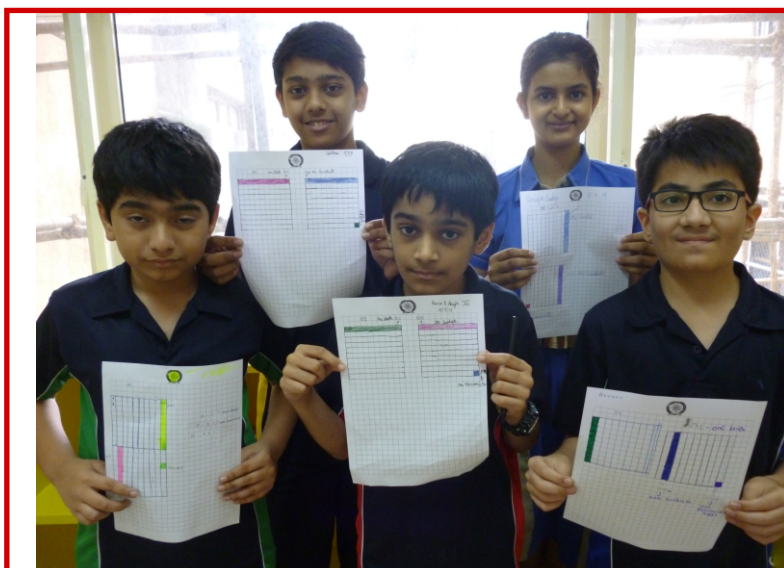

This activity helped the students to understand how decimal numbers are formed.



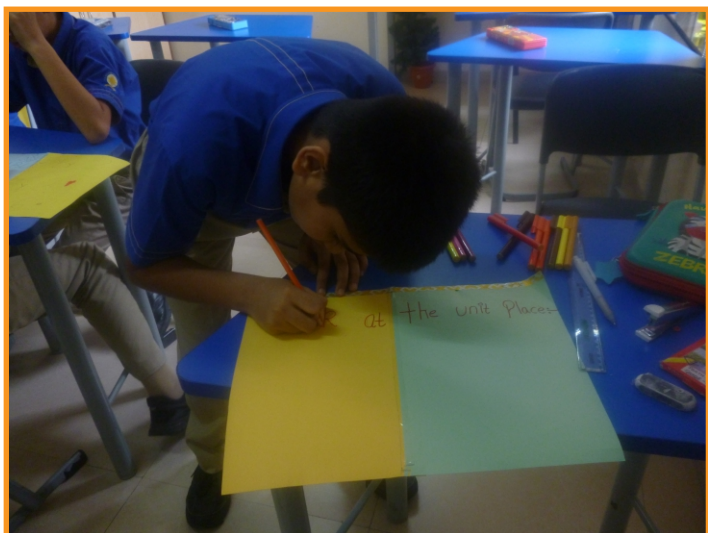


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Rules of Divisibility

The crane is symbol of long-life as Japanese folklore believes the crane to live for 1000 years. The crane is also a symbol of happiness, good luck and peace.

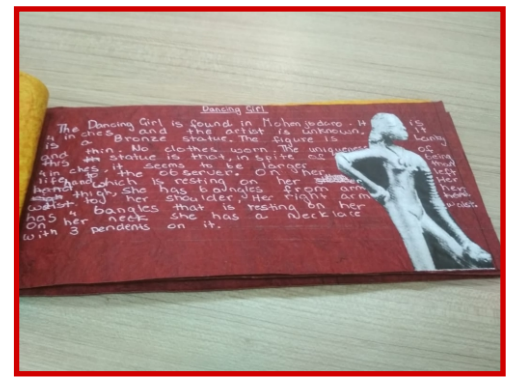
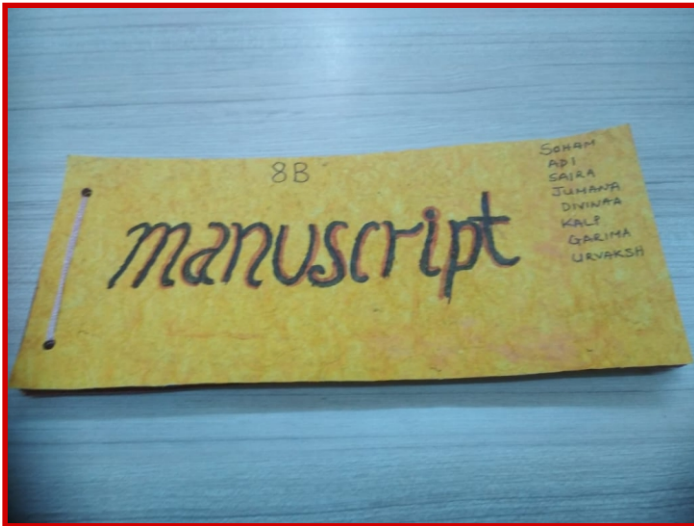
